affirmative forms	negative forms	questions
l've (I have) been	I haven't (have not) been	Have I been?
You've (You have) been	You haven't (have not) been	Have you been?
He/she/it's (He/she/it has) been	He/she/it hasn't (has not) been	Has he/she/it been?
We've (We have) been	We haven't (have not) been	Have we been?
You've (You have) been	You haven't (have not) been	Have you been?
They've (They have) been	They haven't (have not) been	Have they been?

#### **Short answers**

Yes, I have. / Yes, you have. / Yes, he has ... No, I haven't. / No, you haven't. / No, he hasn't ...

- We use the **present perfect** to talk about our experiences (things that happened to us in the past), but we do not say when they happened.
- We make the **present perfect** of **be** with *have/has* + *been*.
- been is called the past participle. Every verb has a past participle form.
